St Louis Symphony Makes Triumphant Return to California

The St. Louis Symphony, led by Music Director David Robertson, embarked on its tour of California in April 2010, with performances in Los Angeles (Walt Disney Concert Hall), Palm Desert (McCallum Theater) Davis (Mondavi Center for the Performing Arts), and in San Francisco (Davies Hall). Violinist Gil Shaham was the soloist on tour, performing violin concertos of Mozart, Stravinsky

and Prokofiev. This tour included the Orchestra's debuts at both the Walt Disney Concert Hall in Los Angeles and at the Mondavi Center on the campus of the University of California – Davis. It is also the SLSO's first California tour since 1999.

Music Director David Robertson is a native Californian who grew up


Music Makes a Difference in the Dominican Republic

4th Tour with Classical Movements for Globe-Trotting Yale Glee Club

In June, the Yale Glee Club traveled to the Dominican Republic on a tour of Music and Outreach. The Glee Club set up a home base in the mountain village of Vallejuelo, about 40 minutes from San Juan. Local students commuted by flatbed trucks from villages near and far to take part in workshops conducted by members of Yale Glee Club.

The Yale Glee Club members took advantage of their multiple talents and taught short courses in creative writing, quilting, film, movement and rhythm, acting, and singing. Among the many activities, the students wrote poems and short stories, interviewed and filmed each other using digital video cameras, learned to juggle, played theater games, and learned choral songs with YGC director **Jeffrey Douma**.

Despite the language barrier, the Yale Glee Club members and

Largest American Musical Group Approved by US Government for Travel to Cuba

In late June, 210 members of the Yale Alumni Chorus, directed by Dr. Jeffrey Douma, embarked on a 10 day tour to Cuba. In this extraordinary tour, Yale University's Alumni Chorus continued its long history as of one of the nation's finest musical ambassadors through

remarkable concerts and tremendous people-topeople encounters with Cuban musicians.

CM arranged for the Yale Alumni Chorus to receive a high level invitation from the Cuban Government to perform four concerts with orchestra and choruses, as well as several exchanges, masterclasses and cultural experiences.

They performed with a Cuban choir at the theatre in Matanzas, and with a Cuban chamber choir at the Basílica Menor del Convento de San Francisco de Asís. Their final two performances, including the celebratory Independence Day concert with New Amsterdam Singers, were held at the capital's Lázaro Peña Theater

The Yale Alumni Chorus performed multiple joint concerts with seven Cuban choirs. It was a wonderful way to bring together the two countries. The choir received

To culminate their stay in Cuba, the Yale Alumni Chorus took part in a friendship baseball game with a team of Cuban choruses.

Recently, President Obama issued an executive order easing restrictions on travel by U.S. citizens to Cuba. Although American tourists will still be unable to travel to Cuba for vacations, the new travel rules broaden the categories of persons authorized to travel. The administration will restore the broader "people-to-people" category of travel, which allows "purposeful" visits to promote cultural interaction between U.S. and Cuban citizens. Classical Movements served as concert planner and artistic advisor for the Yale Alumni Chorus for this concert tour.

National Symphony Orchestra Continues Outstanding Tradition of Outreach

West Virginia the site of the National Symphony Orchestra's 2010 American Residency

In 1992, the National Symphony Orchestra of the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts began a project unique throughout the world: The American Residencies. Since its inception in 1992, a hallmark of the project has been its responsiveness to the artistic and educational wishes of each state. Each state prepares a

list of requests, ranging from in-school appearances to workshops for teachers to full orchestral concerts, and prioritizes them for the National Symphony Orchestra, with the Orchestra then fulfilling as many of those requests as logistics, scheduling and budgetary limitations allow. Because of the generous support of many organizations, all proceeds from any ticket

sales resulting from these events remain within the state to support local arts organizations.

The Orchestra accepts one invitation each year, making a state or a region the focus of a host of activities. In 2010, that state was **West Virginia**. Between April 5 and April 13 members of the Orchestra participated in approximately 150 education and performance

activities throughout the state. Classical Movements made travel arrangements for the tour to Morgantown, Wheeling, Glenville, Huntington, Princeton and Charleston, West Virgina. The orchestra spent time in each city, giving lectures, music clinics, masterclasses, solo, chamber ensemble and full orchestral concerts.

To date, more than 2,000 educational, performance and

outreach events have taken place in more than a dozen states as part of the American Residencies and approximately 385,000 people across the nation have attended American Residency events.

An Amazing Cuban Experience for New Amsterdam Singers

In July, the **New Amsterdam Singers** departed on a 7-day Concert Tour of **Cuba**. The concert tour began with a rare opportunity: They joined the 210 members of the **Yale Alumni Chorus** and four other choirs to perform a celebratory **Independence Day concert** at **Havana's Lázaro Peña Theater**. This marked the first time Cuban and American Choirs performed together on the 4th of July.

TV, radio and newspaper coverage was enormous for the week. America's top diplomat in Cuba - the Chief of Mission for the U.S. Interest Section was in attendance at this concert.
